<b>Connect America Update</b> Sindy Von Bank	<ul> <li>Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM) Program Update</li> <li>Connect America is the largest independent provider in the US for emergency response systems</li> <li>Focus on care for patients in their homes</li> <li>Wyoming Department of Health secured some FCC grant funds for RPM for telehealth at the end of 2020</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>25 Wyoming providers applied for the funding/RPM devices</li> </ul>

- 16 of those providers implemented a program
- Staffing shortage has been noted as one of the biggest barriers in terms of the program and keeping it going
- 7-8 providers are successfully utilizing and continuing the program

#### **Questions for Sindy:**

- How many patients has this impacted in the state?
  - A couple hundred
- What are some additional barriers other than staffing shortages?
   Cellular service and the lack of it in certain areas
- What additional supports do providers need to help make them implement?
  - Connect America has worked with groups (trainings, procedures, etc.) but if there are no champions in the organization leading the charge and identifying patients (chronic, high risk), it doesn't become a priority in the organization
- Does Connect America have information on ROI and ROH (return on investment and health) for RPM?
  - Providers should bring in around \$100 a month per patient after communication fees are paid (additional cost savings around saved visits to ED, etc.)
  - Devices are covered with the grant but there is a monthly cost per patient (\$40 per patient per month for communication fees)
- What parameters are being monitored?
