Definition of Telehealth:

- “Telehealth—sometimes called telemedicine—lets your health care provider care for you without an in-person office visit. Telehealth is done primarily online with internet access on your computer, tablet, or smartphone.” – Telehealth.HHS.gov

Background:

- The Public Access Telehealth Spaces (PATHS) project creates private telehealth booths in three public libraries.
- The PATHS booths offer people a space with a computer and internet to be able to connect to healthcare providers virtually.

- Park County Library in Cody
- Goshen County Library in Torrington

What is Available:

- Soundproof, private booth
- Library support staff
- Technology (computer, speakers, internet connection)
