Telehealth Coordinator Description

- Telehealth coordinators manage telehealth programs in remote and urban settings.
- Telehealth coordinators serve as the liaison between healthcare provider, information technology services and the patient.
- Telehealth coordinators manage administrative and technical functions.
- Telehealth coordinators contribute to continuous improvement in patient care.

Good Timing for the Course

- In 2022, transformation in healthcare delivery due to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Federal Public Health Emergency funding
- Telehealth addressed the barriers of providing healthcare in Wyoming
- Allowed patients continuity of care with providers
- Healthy People 2030 objective to increase population level broadband access
- Insurance expanded services eligible for reimbursement telephone and video





Student Experiences

Student Success in the Field

- 96% of HITM graduates work in healthcare within six months
 - Students with Telehealth certification work earlier
 - Many HIT job descriptions require telehealth experience/knowledge Telehealth specialties:
 - Virtual healthcare receptionist
 - ▶ Telehealth revenue cycle management
 - ▶ Telehealth Speech pathologist
 - ▶ Telehealth licensed mental health counselor
 - ▶ RN telehealth educators and forensic nurse examiners
 - ▶ Urgent care telehealth medical director
 - Academic telehealth emergency radiologist

Expanded Future Telehealth Curriculum

- Job opportunities for certified Telehealth Coordinators in Wyoming on a job board
 - ▶ Offer a complete package for students upon certification

Academic Course Next Semester

- ▶ In fall 2025, academic 3 credit elective course open to all majors
 - Pairing the Telehealth Coordinator course with a Cybersecurity elective for strong technology background
 - Add Telehealth to the Medical Office Essentials certificate in HITM program to broaden skills
