



Telehealth 🤝 Access to Healthcare

- Physical Barriers
 - Less travel required for appointments
- Increased Access to Providers
 - Primary Care Practitioners
 - Specialists
 - Mental Health Therapists
- Timeliness
 - Both patient and provider
- Comfort and security

- Access barriers still exist
 - Limited internet services
 - Outdated/insufficient technology
 - Digital literacy
 - Privacy



Telehealth Access Points

- A Telehealth Access Point (TAP) is a dedicated public space for individuals to access a telehealth appointment.
 - Adequate internet connection
 - Device with a working camera, speaker, and microphone
 - Privacy considerations
 - Some TAPs may have support staff available to assist

Public Access Telehealth Spaces (PATHS)

- The project aims to place TAPs in community spaces.
 - Open to the public
 - Safe/comfortable
 - Central location, public transportation
- Provides users with access to telehealth appointments.
 - Necessary technology
 - Reliable internet connection
 - Private, soundproof space
 - Healthcare accessories (BP cuffs, Scales)
 - Friendly and knowledgeable staff






Inside view of the booth in the Natrona County Public Library

Why Libraries?

- “Third Space”
 - Public, informal gathering spot outside of home, and work.
 - Comfortable, community oriented.
 - Designated stops on public transportation.
- Data’s in: Wyomingites love their libraries
 - Each county has at least one library.
 - People in WY visit the library 2x more per year than the average American.
- Library Staff rocks!
 - Trusted community members.
 - Excellent resources for navigating technology and other community resources.



How the PATHS Project Addresses Access



The contributing factors and populations were determined using the best available Wyoming data, scientific literature, and expert opinion.

→ Social & Economic

- Accessible location, open to all community members.

→ Physical & Policy Environment

- Libraries are centrally located
- Often have public transportation
- Have reliable internet services

→ Our Neighbors

- Community space with several free resources.

→ Access to Care

- Patients are able to connect with their provider more easily.
- Improve specialist access.
- Decreased wait time.

What is the Process?

Booking the Appointment

1./2. Patron makes a telehealth appointment with their provider using a personal email address.

1./2. Patron visits library website to reserve the booth during their TH appointment.

Before the Appointment

3. Patron arrives to the library ~15-30 minutes before the appointment.

4. Library staff walks patron over to the booth, unlocks the door, and familiarizes patron with the space/equipment.

5. If necessary: staff assists with IT help (logging in to computer, accessing appointment, ensuring video and audio is working prior to the appointment).

After the Appointment

6. Patron unlocks the door, and alerts the front desk staff that they're finished with their appointment.

7. Staff checks booth to ensure all the patron is fully logged out of the computer and no personal information was left behind.

8. Booth is cleaned and disinfected using a spray cleaner, HEPA air filter.

9. Booth is ready for the next appointment!

How the Telehealth Network Supports

- Provider awareness and produce materials for public awareness marketing.
- Outcomes evaluation.
- Provider education for telehealth.
- Grant writing and management.





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➔ Evaluation

- Monthly usage reports



January 2024 – August 2025

- **Cumulatively, all three booths have hosted:**

- 192 total users
- 19,033 minutes of use

→ **Park County – 10,030 minutes total**



- 528 minutes/month
- 103 total users, 5.7 users/month

→ **Natrona County – 5,640 minutes total**

- 267 minutes/month
- 45 total users, 2.3 users/month

→ **Goshen County – 3,843 minutes total**


- 202 minutes/month
- 44 total users, 2.4 users/month



In Addition to 1:1 Telehealth Visits

- Library staff reported patrons regularly coming in to use the accessory health equipment located in the booths.
- In Goshen County, a HeartCorps member promoted the booth within the community and utilized the booth to conduct educational webinars.
- The space is frequently used for a quiet private space to access healthcare information.
 - Health insurance enrollment
 - Searching for health-related services

→ **These uses are not currently captured by our usage reporting system.**




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
